

# Boundaries of the Parish of St. Mark's Dundela.

The Parish of St. Mark's is bounded on the **North** by a line proceeding in an easterly direction from the wooden bridge at Lillysburn Station on the Belfast and Holywood Railway. This line follows the centre of the road from the Station to the Belfast and Holywood New Road, thence comes southwards towards Strandtown, following the centre line of the Belfast and Holywood New Road for about thirty perches, and then again goes eastward following the centre line of the Road which divides Richmond Lodge from Clifton House as far as the angular bend near Knocknagoney National School. Thence goes southward following the centre line of the old Holywood Road for about forty perches, and thence again goes eastward following the dotted line on the Ordnance Survey Map marking the boundary between the Townlands of Knocknagoney and Ballymachan as far as the point marking the extreme north-eastern boundary of the Townland of Ballymachan. The **Eastern** boundary begins here and is a line coming southwards and following the western boundary-line of the Parish of Dundonald, including the Townlands of Ballymachan, Killeen, and Ballycloughan, with the exception of a narrow strip averaging about three perches wide towards its northern extremity, and about seventy perches in its southern part, of the Townland of Killeen which is included in the Parish of Dundonald. The eastern boundary ends at a point about sixty perches to the west of Rose Park. Thence the **Southern** boundary proceeds westward following the bed of the Knock River as far as the point marking the extreme north-western boundary of the Townland
